Jason Pulliam Justice Fourth Court of Appeals

Justice Jason Pulliam serves on the Fourth Court of Appeals in San Antonio, Texas. Governor Rick Perry appointed him to the Fourth Court on January 8, 2015. Prior to serving on the court of appeals, Justice Pulliam was Judge of Bexar County, County Court at Law No. 5 from 2010-2014. As Judge of County Court at Law No. 5, he handled a wide variety of criminal cases and violations of the Texas Penal Code.

Justice Pulliam also presided over civil cases with a maximum jurisdictional limit of \$200,000. He made County Court No.5 available to hear matters from the Civil District Court Presiding system to assist the District Court Judges with cases.

Prior to his service on the bench, Justice Pulliam worked for William "Bill" Ford at the law firms of Ball &Weed, P.C. and Ford & Massey, P.C. Justice Pulliam also served as a JAG or military lawyer in the United States Marine Corps from 2000-2004. In 2002, he was the recipient of the Eastern Region Defense Counsel of the Year award.

Justice Pulliam graduated from Texas Southern University's Thurgood Marshall School of Law with honors. He served as a senior staff member on the school's law review. He earned a B.A. and M.A. in Political Science from Brooklyn College.
